**Recycling** and **Transfer Station:** sorting Metal, Aluminum, Mixed paper and corrugated cardboard earn \$\$ and reduce costs for Warner. Plastics #1 and #2 (clear/green and laundry/milkbottles) are recycled. **"clamshell" style boxes** are not recyclable.

Staples will accept electronics, and ink/toner cartridges. Goodwill will take electronics.

ON HOLD: Please do not bring Stretchy plastics to the United Church of Warner. Clean grocery bags and ziplock bags may be dropped in the box inside Market Basket. The Food Pantry needs clean bags. OR use your own reusable bags for shopping!






