Warner Weather

The winds on Wednesday dropped a tree across Rte 103 near the Transfer Station, which caused traffic to be detoured via Waterloo Street until it could be cleared, then a single lane of traffic was in effect until after 8 pm while crews restored the power lines to a new replacement pole. The Newmarket Road area and Rte 103 residents up to Bradford Elementary School were without power for 4 hours while work was in progress. A giant pine also came down at 11 pm on Kearsarge Mtn Rd. It took Eversource almost 6 hours to clean up and restore power.

Be aware of falling tree and limb danger during windy days, as well as **after** it stops!
