School buildings discussion: The KRSD Board has started discussing options for solutions to the District's high projected cost for maintenance and repairs of multiple buildings. The Superintendent has been visiting Town Selectboards (see Warner BOS, June 10). On June 19 the School Board narrowed down to 3 options of 4, 1) "bandaiding" the elem. schools, 2) renovating the elem. schools, or 3) closing the Warner and Sutton elem. schools and busing to New London & Bradford.
