Since the beginning of 2025 we have seen a steady increase of households. We are averaging 7 **new** households a month versus our previous 4. In July we assisted 219 households (households can come in once a week), this equates to 419 individuals (170 elderly, 169 adults, and 80 children). The food provided = 2933 meals. The need is constantly increasing, and your support is needed now more than ever.


