

News to Use

The New Hampshire Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) is transitioning to a fully appointment-based system beginning Monday, November 3, 2025. "additional appointments will be available to accommodate customer volume. The busiest DMV locations in Concord, Manchester, Nashua, and Epping will also offer appointments during extended hours until 5 p.m., twice a week. Additionally, a limited block of same-day appointments will be made available each day for customers with urgent transactions. Customers can find appointment availability on the DMV website, www.dmv.nh.gov/ where they can select "Make an Appointment" on the homepage. DMV staff will assist walk-in customers with finding appointments, including at other DMV locations if necessary." Or by phone: footnoted-100/603/227-4000.

Preview New health insurance plans & prices at www.healthcare.gov/apply-and-enroll/health-insurance-plans-estimator-overview/ Open Enrollment for 2026 starts November 1. "During the government shutdown, if you have a 2025 health insurance plan, continue using your plan and providers. If you don't have a plan, you can use this site [above] to apply for and access coverage."

Governor Ayotte has removed the ban on outside burning and issuance of burn permits. **Be sure to get a permit!** Outside burning permits are required for any outside burning unless the ground is completely covered with snow. The NH Department of Environmental Services also prohibits the open burning of household waste. Burning permits are <u>available at https://nh.burnsafeamerica.com/</u> or from the local Forest Fire Warden, or some Deputy Wardens https://warnernh.gov/departments/fd/


Your Donations Keep Library Services Strong!
